How do you feel this nominee would be able to contribute by being on the MANNA board?

In her words: I am interested in giving back to the community. While in undergrad I took a keen interested in the dissolution of food deserts. Many food deserts are in black and brown communities. It makes it difficult for these families to have access to healthy food for their families as they have to travel far, often without transportation to get access. Manna's mission to end hunger in WNC has been bringing food to those that are hungry for some time.
